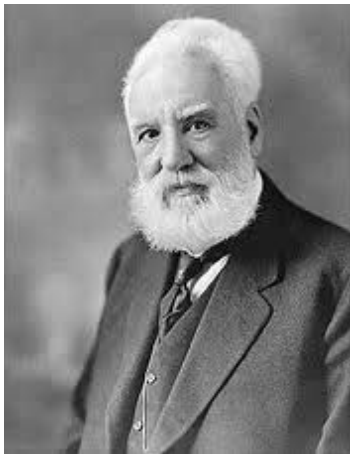


Alexander Graham Bell

Alexander was born in Edinburgh at 16 Charlotte Street March 3rd 1847.

He grew up with 2 brothers who both died with tuberculosis 3 years apart. His father was professor Alexander Melville Bell and his mother was Eliza Grace Bell.



Alexander was born poor as a boy but he grew rich with his inventions.

When he was young he was home schooled until he was enrolled at Royal High School in Edinburgh and left at the age of 15. Onlt completing his first four forms. He went to Edinburgh University with his Brother Melville. Then he was accepted into London University.

Alexander Graham Bell was famous for inventing the telephone in 1876. The first word said into the telephone was "Dr Watson can you come here please" because Alexander had spilled acid on his leg when filling the battery. His invention is still used today but a little more moderised.

Alexander taught elocution and music at Elgin Western House Academy In Elgin Moray Scotland .

He died of diabeaties and was also infected with anemia in August the 2nd 1922.
