

Glen Moray

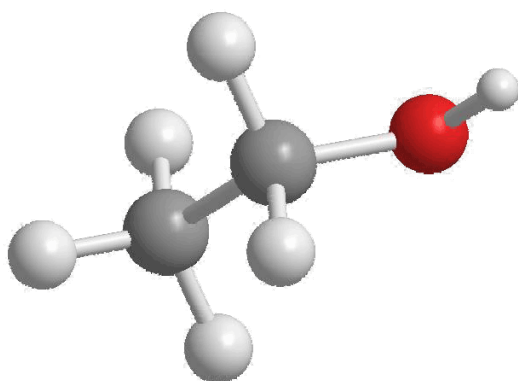
The Glen Moray Glenlivet Distillery Company is a single malt scotch whisky distillery based in Speyside, Scotland.



It started as a brewery run by Robert Thorne & Sons, and was converted into a distillery in 1897 by Glen Moray Glenlivet Distillery Company. The company now belongs to La Martiniquaise which uses its production primarily for blended whiskey.

Glen Moray is most likely based next to the River Lossie because it is an ideal location because it is right next to River Lossie which is a good water supply. Moray is famed for its growing conditions, there for there is a good supply of grain, and moray supplies the work force and market.

The whisky produced in Glen Moray Distillery is made by a process called fermentation. Fermentation is a biological process in which sugars such as glucose are broken down by bacteria and yeast to give ethanol and carbon dioxide.



The chemical equation for fermentation is $C_6H_{12}O_6 = 2C_2H_5OH + 2CO_2$

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
