Some of the raw materials that baxters use are raw vegetables in the soup. They also use a lot of aluminium and tin for making the cans to contain the soup.

The products of Baxters are traditional Scottish food, which they to sell to a variety of different customers for them to eat for their pleasure.

Baxters is one of the largest industries in the area, and is one of the highest employers in the area. Baxters is known worldwide so it brings a lot of money to the area an without it the area would lose a lot of tourism.

Baxters is best known for canned soups which are made to unique recipes this distinguishes them from other soup makers. Their famous soup is Royal Game. The size of the company has grown since early 20th century when it was a small grocers but they still maintain an image as a "family business."

Baxters use up a lot of tin for their tin cans. They use tin because it is a highly workable metal. Tin's atomic mass is 118.69 and its atomic number is 50 and the symbol is Sn. Iron cans are coated with a layer of tin which acts as a physical barrier stopping water and oxygen coming into contact with the iron and causing the iron to rust.
